

1. EXPLANATORY NOTE

1.1 GENERAL

The purpose of the proposed changes to Parts 1,2,5,6, 9 and Attachment C is to provide further guidance and explanatory material.

There are a number of factors that have determined the need for and timing of this amendment:

- Changes to ICAO Standards and Recommended Practices (SARPs) that are due to become effective on 28th November 2024 as outlined in ICAO State Letter adoption of Amendment 19 Annex 13:
- Additional Minor amendments proposed by the Bureau on the Recommendation of the Regulations Committee as per the Committee's meetings sequel to other processes established in the draft Regulations as attached.

A 30-day consultation period is given, effective from 4th November, 2024. The Bureau must receive comments back by 30days post the day of dispatch/receipt by stakeholders. Comments that are not submitted in the appropriate Form provided or which are received after this date may not be considered.

1.3 COMMENT RESPONSE DOCUMENT (CRD)

The comments will be reviewed 14days after the 30days consultation period elapses. All comments received will be responded to and incorporated into a Comment Response Document (CRD), which will also be posted on the consultations page of the NSIB website. The CRD may contain a list of all persons and/or organizations that have provided comments.

The CRD will be available for four (4) weeks after the consultation has closed.

1.4 REGULATORY IMPACT ASSESSMENT

<u>Intent</u>

The intent of this proposed change to Parts 1,2,5,6, 9 and Attachment C of NSIB Civil Aviation Regulations 2023) is to ensure that the requirements of this regulation remain current.

- a) assist Nigeria (NSIB) in identifying what RPAS accidents to investigate for improvement to safety;
- b) assist Nigeria (NSIB) in providing more timely and regular updates on the progress of investigation during investigations of accidents and incidents that draw heightened public attention;
- c) improve provisions to ensure the effective use of recorded ground-based data during accident and incident investigations;
- d) assist Nigeria and ICAO in making Final reports available to the public; and
- e) assist Nigeria in release of Final reports in a timely manner

Option

The NSIB has adopted the changes to ICAO State letters and the requirements and guidance for Parts 1,2,5,6,9 and Attachment C are hereby proposed to be current

Impact

The proposed amendments for adoption are valuable, relevant and would be a catalyst for safety.

Safety: The intended changes are expected to have a positive impact on safety

Economic: The intended changes are not expected to have any Economic impact
